

Trading Relations

- There are three major trade Agreements currently in force with Japan:
 - Comprehensive and Progressive Agreement for Trans-Pacific Partnership (CPTPP).
 - The Japan Australia Economic Partnership Agreement (JAEPA) entered into force on 15 January 2015.
 - Japan and Australia are parties to the Regional Comprehensive Economic Partnership which is a regional free trade agreement that will complement and build upon Australia's existing free trade agreements with 15 other Indo-Pacific countries
- Defence Australia Japan Reciprocal Access Agreement was recently signed and is a historical step forward in our bilateral relationship
- A number of concessions were secured for Australian agricultural exporters, while Australian tariffs on electronics, white goods and cars were lowered. Australia is Japan's third largest import supplying market, accounting for 6.3% of Japan's total imports in 2019 and purchasing 2.1% of Japan's exports
- The Northern Territory supports the Australian Clean Hydrogen Trade Program (ACHTP) with commitment to start exporting clean hydrogen to Japan. The first round of the Program focuses on the export of clean hydrogen to Japan under the Japan-Australia Partnership on Decarbonisation through Technology

Trade and Investment

The NT Government has identified Japan as a high priority market for international trade and investment. Japan is the Northern Territory's largest trading partner and will remain so for the foreseeable future

In 2021-22 financial year

- Australian goods and services exported to Japan was values at \$92.8 billion
- Australian goods and services imported from Japan was values at \$24.4 billion
- Japan was the NT's largest export market, with exports increasing 130.1% to \$7.5 billion, reflecting increases in confidential goods, likely liquefied natural gas.
- Imported goods from Japan to the NT increased 10.3% to \$150 million, due to an increase in iron and steel.
- An ACIL Allen economic assessment of the impact of Ichthys LNG from 2012 to 2050 found the project would provide a \$118 billion boost in economic output. At peak production, Ichthys LNG will boost the size of the Northern Territory economy by 15 per cent.
